Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2017-18 school year, Seven Oak will continue our balanced approach of adding more academic support and enrichment opportunities for students. Even with lagging funding, we have been able to maintain and in some course areas expand our elective and enrichment opportunities. This year we have doubled the amount of instructional time in Math for approximately 40% of our students to 100 min. per day on a full instructional day and 60 minutes per day on an early release. Readiness in math is the number one indicator of High School graduation and career success. We are proud to be in our 5th year of implementation of AVID at Seven Oak Middle School. AVID is a college readiness system

that has been proven to increase rigor and achievement for all students. Through our work with the Common Core State Standards, we promise to continue to deliver the same excellence you have come to expect from us. Family's you can help by reviewing your student's assignments and grades online, monitoring your student's homework, checking his/her planner daily, attending parent -teacher conferences, and volunteering. We welcome your partnership and we look forward to partnering with you over this coming year to make sure all of our students reach their potential.

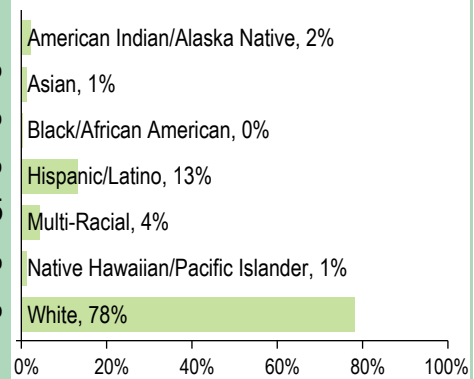
